FEE SCHEDULE

Guardianship Fee: £4,000 annually (includes VAT)

Included:

- 24-hour emergency support for your child
- Airport meet and greet when using Regent Guardians transport
- Unaccompanied minor services (if needed)
- Initial and fortnightly visits to your child
- Weekly phone calls and/or messaging with your child
- Support for your child if they are homesick or need help in any way
- Half termly report to you
- Liaison between yourself and the school, and the child and the school
- Organising and booking public transport tickets within the UK (for students aged 16 or older)
- Booking Regents Guardians drivers or taxis
- Organising attendance for your child at school or university Open Days (if required)
- Sourcing extra tuition in consultation with your child, school and yourself (if required)

- Attending school parents' meetings and providing written feedback to you
- Introducing and pairing up your child with a suitable host family, and
- Checking, training and inspecting your child's host family on a regular basis

Not included:

- Actual travel costs (at cost)
- Extra visits additional to those listed (£50 per visit plus travel expenses)
- Staff costs to accompany on Open Days (£150 per day)
- Extra Tuition (at cost)
- Host family accommodation including three meals a day (£50 a night)
- Bag storage (at cost)
- Translation costs, if required (at cost)
- Pocket money

The Guardianship Fee is payable in advance. Your child must also have a Student Expense Account to cover optional services when needed and for emergencies. This account must start with £1,500, payable before arrival in the UK, and you will need to top it up when it falls to £500. Any money remaining in the account when the child leaves our guardianship will be refunded within one month of the child leaving, having deducted any outstanding fees or expenses.
